the high sap content can cause flammable creosote to build up in the chimney. Burning green wood will also cause creosote buildup. To prevent creosote buildup and decrease the risk of a chimney fire, burn dry, well-seasoned hardwoods and maintain a flue temperature higher than 250 degrees Fahrenheit.
